
HOW DOES IT WORK: ATMS

Have you ever wondered how an ATM works? Here is a basic explanation.

Electronic Transfers

The ATM electronically sends the information to the ATM's host processor and then on to your credit union. If you requested a withdrawal, your balance is checked and the money is deducted from your account.


